The Growing Demand For Food

Over the past four years, demand has surged beyond anything in our history, and it continues to climb.

Households served: 1,968 in 2021  3,568 in 2025

Individuals served: 4,282 in 2021  9,399 in 2025

Total Pantry visits: 45,131 in 2021  111,733 in 2025

Forty percent of households report skipping meals to save money. Fifteen percent are seniors on fixed incomes that can't keep pace with rising costs.

We are launching an \$8 million campaign to secure and transform a permanent home for The Pantry and expand an endowment for long-term sustainability.

Longtime community leaders and philanthropists Karen and Dick Vaughn have made a \$3.5 million charitable gift towards that goal, leaving \$4.5 million yet to raise.

Campaign Goal Breakdown

Purchase the Waukesha facility at 1705 S. Prairie Avenue.....	\$1,750,000
Renovate to create a safe, efficient and welcoming space.....	\$3,750,000
Grow the Endowment to stabilize food purchasing for the future.....	\$2,000,000
Purchase and install walk-in refrigeration.....	\$500,000
Campaign Total.....	\$8,000,000

Growing demand has simply outpaced what the current building can support.

Safety Concerns

- Parking spills onto busy streets with traffic in a confined parking lot space.
- Semi-trucks deliver food among families on foot.
- Without a working dock, unloading is unsafe.

Inadequate Client Space

- Waiting areas are too small, leaving families outside in harsh weather.
- Inside, narrow aisles make shopping difficult and result in longer wait times.

Limited Cold Storage

- Refrigerators and freezers are full.
- Aging equipment has reached the end of its useful life, making it expensive to maintain.

The Solution

A new, permanent home at **1705 S. Prairie Avenue**. This 20,000 square-foot-facility will be renovated to serve the community. The impact of this solution is immediate and lasting. We can increase the quantity of food distributed while ensuring greater efficiency and safety. Families will be welcomed into an uplifting space and served with dignity. Volunteers will have the resources they need to serve guests. The Pantry will be positioned to meet the rising need for decades to come.
